# **Galah Regional Photography Prize 2025**



The Galah Regional Photography Prize has been created to encourage excellence in contemporary photography from regional Australia. The intention of the Prize is to celebrate, support and advance the practice of regional photographers.

#### Who can enter?

The prize is open to regional photographers making any type of still photography – fine art, photojournalism, portraiture, landscape, documentary, collage etc.

To be eligible, you must live in regional Australia. We are using Regional Australia Institute's definition – "everything beyond the major capital cities of Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Perth, Adelaide and Canberra."

#### Are there categories?

The purpose of the prize is to support regional artists to pursue whatever photographic form and content they are interested in. The subject matter can be "regional" but it doesn't have to be. There is no theme. There are no categories. We welcome all types of still, 2D photography – fine art, photojournalism, portraiture, landscape, documentary, collage etc – made by regional photographers.

#### May Set Subject - "Still Life"

#### **Definition:**

Still life photography involves capturing images of inanimate objects intentionally placed on a flat surface or table. The primary focus of this type of photography is to create visually appealing and artistic compositions with carefully arranged objects, paying close attention to lighting, composition, and background.


#### **Judging Criteria:**

The image must only include inanimate objects in the frame. All genres like food, flowers, antiques, glassware, instruments, toys, art, jewellery, candles, or any everyday object is acceptable. The image should contain more than one object. The image does not need to be taken indoors, but the objects must be sourced by the photographer (rather than something they have come across that has been arranged by another person). The image can be colour or monochrome. All styles of still life are acceptable - modern, fine art, product, food, fashion, vintage, etc. Images will be technically sound, with appropriate lighting to show off the objects, and demonstrate a visually pleasing arrangement and composition.

#### **Set Subject Competitions**

Do you know where to find the details of each month's set subject? I only ask this as each month we are seeing images entered in the set subject competition that do not comply with the criteria set by the judge. The best place to find these details is on the club website.





In addition, please note that the October Set Subject is **different**. You can still submit two entries, but each entry must be a collection of three images. Detailed instructions for assembling your entries are on the club website. From the menu select **Competitions>Set Subject**. On the list of monthly Set Subjects, next to October click on the "SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS" link to view or download the instructions. If you have any questions about these instructions, please email Roy Killen.

#### **Club Competition Rules**

Please make sure you read the club's competition rules and follow them. One such rule is that you cannot enter the same image in a digital competition and a print competition in the same month. Refer to the section in our rules under the heading "Restriction on entry of images in Monthly Competitions".



# Photographic Society of America (PSA) and Interclub Competitions

Our club is a member of PSA, which allows us to participate in the PSA Interclub competitions, where we compete against clubs from all over the world. Full details about how these competitions are conducted are in the Club Documents section of the club website and the latest PSA competition news can be found on the club website at **Competitions/PSA Interclub Competitions.** 

In previous years, our club has been very successful in the Digital sections – Colour, Monochrome, Nature, Photojournalism and Photo Travel.

This year, we have expanded our participation to include the Colour and Monochrome Print sections of the Interclub. If your image is selected to represent our club, the cub will subsidise the cost.

When submitting entries for the PSA competitions the only restriction is that you cannot enter an image that has previously been selected to represent LMCC or Belmont 16s.














# **Valentine Bowling Club Photoshoot**

# **Helen Walker – GMPSA (PSA Grand Master)**

To gain this award you need to have a minimum of 3,000 accepted images in internationally recognised PSA competitions. The images can be from any area of photography you like (colour, mono, nature, photojournalism or travel), digital or print, but to get 3000 acceptances I think you need to develop your skills in all these areas. The PSA helps you do this with free to members education courses and webinars. The PSA has provided lots of learning opportunities, and the process has been fun.

I have been very lucky to be a long-standing member of the Lake Macquarie Camera Club. It has been because of our local club and its members dedication to the art of photography that I first became interested photography. The club has provided many opportunities to for me to learn and grow my photographic skills. I have found it to be a great environment in which to explore the many facets of photography, met people and just have fun.



I found my photography improved once I started entering competitions, both local and international. This is because entering competitions makes you think more about your images. It develops your critical eye and provides opportunity to get broader feedback on your photos.

To obtain the award took a long time. My first international acceptance was for End of Day Maitland Jan 2015. My last acceptance was Dawn Reflections Jan 2025. 10 Years. I have had breaks of 6 months and several 3-month periods where I did not enter competitions. I try to develop my skills and collect worthy entries before I enter a competition.

I include 4 images that I really like. I am trying to move more towards a digital artist format... again, a long-term project. The first three images have won awards internationally and the fourth, I am still playing with.

Each month we will include some links to news stories on the internet, competition results and well-known photographer's work. If you have an item of interest, please let us know. - In previous editions I have recommended the documentary series on SBS on Demand featuring seven Australian photographers, called "Language of Light". The series looks at seven Australian photographers, each with an impressive body of work and unique photographic style. My quick reading of the seven photographers that are featured would indicate that their work would be broadly classified as photojournalism. I have watched further episodes and particularly enjoyed the episode showcasing Jacqueline Mickelman, a portrait photographer who relies on natural light. "Her massive body of work includes a wide range of private commissions, featuring a large collection of portraits of important Australians."

This is the remarkable Adams Plaza Bridge in the Canary Wharf area of London. I took this shot at 6:30 in the morning so I wouldn't have to deal with lots of pedestrians. I used a 16-35mm lens set to 16mm to exaggerate the perspective of the bold graphic design and the wild pattern of color. My settings were 1/100, f/5.0, and 2000 ISO. When photographing symmetry, particularly with architecture, it's essential to position yourself dead center on the subject. If you are just a little off-center, horizontal and vertical lines in the composition become skewed. It amazes me that so many photographers either forget this or have a hard time finding the precise midpoint from which to shoot.

This is an Australian production that takes you all over Australia and explains how their images were taken and then for some of their images how they are edited. It's well worth a look. Easy viewing 20min each episode often featuring well known Aussie photographers.

She recently presented via zoom to the Wangi Camera Club and has kindly left her presentation accessible on her website to view. Her presentation is around monochrome images, predominantly landscape. Towards the end of the presentation there is a demonstration on a couple of methods to convert your images to monochrome. 



# FRANZIS Software – FOCUS Projects 5 Professional – A Quick Review - Bill

### **Chambers**



This is a Focus Stacking program from Germany that I've been evaluating for the past week or so...

While it is not perfect, it does do a very credible job stacking a series of images. It also then has a swathe of options (a little overwhelming at first!) that allow you to refine your image to your heart's content.

I would suggest that it's sort of a combined NIK software + Helicon Focus... It doesn't succeed as a better program than either of these, but it does a reasonable job emulating both – and the price is right – currently Euros20.00 (\$A32) for a short time... (Normally Euro99.00)

I have tried all the other versions of this program and suggest you only bother with the Focus Projects 5 Professional version, as the others only offer the ability to stack 30 images maximum. Professional offers 1500 images. There is a new version 6 Professional (E99.00) that will stack up to 2000 images.

On the website look in the top RHS for a tiny German flag – this will show the page in English. Download only. PayPal accepted.

Note: The program is fairly 'resource heavy' on your computer memory.

... and there is no English language Manual available – I have translated the German Manual if anyone is interested...

Bottom Line: Is it as good as Helicon Focus or Zerene Stacker as a standalone Focus Stacking program? In my opinion, it is not, but as mentioned earlier it does a very creditable job. At the



current asking price of \$A32 it's definitely worth a look if you're just getting into stacking images (that includes Landscape photographers as well as the Macro group!)

# **How's Your Colour Perception? – Bill Chambers**


Colour is largely taken for granted by most people. Colour Perception is very subjective – we all perceive colours differently.

It is not until you take colour fidelity seriously, for example using a grey card to eliminate colour contamination during photography, that you become aware of variations in colour perception.




#### Which Letter Matches Large Image Colour?


Which Orange Colour is More Saturated?




Which Green Colour is More Saturated?

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
